

Dear Children:

We want you to read a lot this summer! This could mean that you are reading 30 minutes every day or even longer on some days to make up for days when you don't read at all. We hope you read about a book per week or a book every 2 weeks if it is a longer chapter book. What is important is that you read books that are "just right" for you on a regular basis. A "just right" book is one that is not too easy or too hard. (Too easy means that when you read your brain is barely active as you flip through the pages, effortlessly devouring line after line, hardly having to think at all; Too hard means that you can't read or understand many words on a page. Not knowing one or two words on a page is okay.)

When you come back to school in September you should have read 5-10 "just right" books. Start reading as soon as you can - maybe even right now! Don't put your reading off until later in the summer. Remember the more you practice reading the easier it gets and the more fun it is!

We have created a summer reading booklist filled with titles of books you might want to read! Be sure to look it over, and take it with you to the library or the bookstore as you are looking for books that will be fun and interesting, while also being a "just right" fit for you.

We have also made a response booklet for you to use as you read. You learned this year how important it is to be active in your mind while you read, and you learned some of the strategies that good readers use to do this. The pages in this booklet will give you ways to practice being an active reader. Use them to share with us some responses to your books. Each book that you read should have one response in your booklet. (It is okay for you to dictate your responses to an adult.)

We hope you have a wonderful fun summer filled with adventures in real life as well as adventures in books! Happy Reading!

Summer Reading Book Recommendations for EACMSI Junior Level

The Junior Level Library is organized into five categories. We talk to the children about how the process of learning to read is like the process of becoming a butterfly. Everyone starts learning the sounds of letters and slowly morphs until they can read big and complicated books with ease. Everyone makes this metamorphosis at their own pace, and the most important thing is to keep practicing reading, by choosing books that are “just right” for the reader. The first step on this path is with books we call “Emergent Readers” these are often short books, with lots of phonetic and early sight words. Some of these books are smaller chapter books. The next four steps are “Egg” “Caterpillar” “Chrysalis” and “Butterfly.” Our readers progress through each level as their reading skills develop until they become a full-fledged, high soaring Butterfly Reader!

Our Summer Reading list is organized into our five categories, and students who have been in Junior Level over the past year should know which level of books will be the “just right” fit for them.

We have also included a list of picture books, either for independent reading if they are a “just right” book for your child, or for reading to your child as a delightful way to spend time together.
